The EdwardT. Conroy Memorial Scholarship Program provides financial aid to:

- o Sons, daughters, stepchildren, or the surviving spouse (who has not remarried) of a member of the United States Armed Forces who died as a result of military service or who suffered a 100% permanent disability as result of military service.
- o A student veteran who suffers a disability of 25% or greater as a result of military service, and has exhausted or is no longer eligible for federal veterans' educational benefits;
- o A POW/MIA of the Vietnam Conflict or his/her son, daughter, or stepchild

Awards may be held for five years of fullime (12 or more undergraduate redits per semester9 or more graduate credits per semester eight years of partime (611 undergraduatecredits per semester6-8 graduate credits per semesteratendance or a combination of both. Recipients may attend at either the undergraduate or the graduate level. Audited courses cannot be used to reach the minimum credits hours required for full-time or part-time status.

<u>Application Process</u>: Initially applicants for the scholarship must submit the Edward T. Conroy Memorial Scholarship application form, with all required documentation, and it must be received by July 15, 2024. Late applications will be considered as long as funds are available.
