I. General Program Information

This dual enrollment option is available to eligible students once they are accepted to the Hagerstown Community College (HCC) Registered Nursing Program. Admission is competitive and based on completed courses and grade point average (GPA). Students will be enrolled as degree students at HCC and Towson University (TU) and begin to take TU courses during the Nursing Program at HCC. Once the Associate of Science (A. S.) Degree is awarded at HCC, students will take the nursing licensure exam (NCLEX-RN) and continue coursework at TU to complete the Bachelor of Science (B. S.) Degree.
