Criteria

- Prize for excellent paper written in a history course
- Open to non-graduating Towson students with a cumulative GPA of 2.8 or higher
- Ties broken by GPA

About this award

Mary Catherine Kahl (1921-1999) taught at Towson State Teachers College from 1942 to 1995, serving as the chair of the History Department from 1966 to 1989. Kahl was particularly known for establishing high standards for writing in history courses, and in this spirit, the Department of History established the Mary Catherine Kahl prize in her honor in 2000. The prize is awarded to History Majors or Minors for an outstanding essay written in a history course.
